In 2019, the Operations Team really focused on training and development. Our goal was to utilize each volunteer more efficiently by creating more collaborative, meaningful roles and reducing redundancy. That could only be done by utilizing the technology at our fingertips. We are incredibly fortunate to have some very bright, creative minds who volunteered their digital strategy expertise to keep our organization growing and adapting with the technological times. We also provided more traditional, in-person, kitten and adult cat workshops throughout the city. Volunteers came out and learned more about TCR's mission and vision, and how to properly care for all the compromised cats and vulnerable kittens we rescue.


We proved our ability to mobilize quickly with large hoarding situations, thanks to our strong volunteer power. A new partnership was forged with Petsmart Empress Walk in North York which increased our adoption numbers. We also formalized our vet care process, created new veterinary clinic partnerships and strengthened our intake, transport and health care programs in 2019.

Hubs were launched throughout the city so that foster homes had quicker access to much needed food and supplies.



Our online shop continues to help generate additional revenue in order to support cats within our care. Combining merchandise sales from events and online, 2019 was a great year, nearly doubling profits made in the previous year. Working again with designer Rachel Armstrong, we introduced new designs to our t-shirt line and added new hats, water bottles, and a book to our offering.

In 2019, the shop went on the road, visiting 8 different events around the GTA and beyond. Stops in London, Waterloo, Niagara, and Toronto brought in over \$9,000 and sales from the online shop totaling over \$9,500. 

Toronto's first Meowfest

Toronto's first Meowfest raises \$20,000+ for TCR

Meowfest is a festival to bring cat lovers together and support shelters and other not-for-profit organizations across Canada. Hosted by Meowbox, Toronto's very first Meowfest featured celebrities Hannah Shaw (Kitten Lady), Andrew Marttila (The Cat Photographer), amongst many others.

Toronto Cat Rescue was selected as the charity partner for the event and through this event was able to raise over \$16,000 for TCR kitties. Paired with donations and merchandise sales, **TCR received over \$21,000 that goes to help vulnerable cats** receive the help they need, and ultimately find their forever homes.



Hoarding Rescues

In 2019, TCR helped Toronto Animal Services save more than 400 cats from two major and three minor hoarding cases across the GTA. In March, over 100 cats were found inside a Toronto home and thanks to the support of the TCR community, we were able to bring almost 50 cats into our care. A short time later in May, more than 300 cats were found in a single Toronto apartment. We were able to bring 200+ cats into our foster care network and eventually help them find their forever homes.

These two hoarding situations gained national and international attention from media and social media with CBC As It Happens, CTV News, The Dodo, Cole and Marmalade, and People magazine all picking up the story.

Save Cats from the Gutter 15th Annual Bowlathon

Toronto Cat Rescue kicked off June at Kennedy Bowl for the 15th Annual Bowlathon in support of kitties. Over 100 bowlers laced up their shoes, raising funds that go directly to supporting TCR cats. With an on-site merchandise table, silent auction, and 50/50 draw, participants had lots to do in-between rounds.

Royal Canin was on-site to give participants free bags of food and provide guidance on what food is best suited to individual cat needs. The event raised over \$35,000 through two major sponsors—Royal Canin and VCA Canada Hospitals, online donations, and individual bowler fundraising support.

Scotiabank Toronto Waterfront Marathon

The Scotiabank Toronto Waterfront Marathon is a favorite fundraising event for Toronto Cat Rescue. This year a team of over 20 runners and walkers braved the early morning on October 20, 2019 to raise more than \$17,000 to help rescue cats in need.

Strengthening Partnerships

Foster Matching Program **Tinder For Cats**

TCR once again was one of just 15 charities selected for this year's Capital One's Digital for Good Tech Jam and Summit.

Spearheaded by Capital One and driven by volunteer developers, designers, and other members of the tech community helping charities like ours solve challenges using innovative technology solutions. This year's challenge was to help solve our current manual and inefficient process of matching new cats with the best suited foster homes. That's where the idea of a *Tinder for Cats* evolved. Working with a technology team, an algorithm was developed that will match

cats instantly with relevant foster homes. This will free up volunteer's time to focus on other important aspects of their roles and less time manually trying to sort through foster families, cat needs, and logistics.

A system like the one developed through this program will help make the process more efficient for volunteers, and save the cats from being mismatched. The better the matches, the better the cats will adapt.



VCA Canada Hospitals new partnership

In 2019, TCR strengthened the partnership with VCA Canada Hospitals. VCA has been a strong partner for years and now provides additional veterinary care to new adopters.

PetSmart Charities Transportation Grant

PetSmart Charities transport grants support PetSmart Charities Adoption Partners' efforts to transport animals from areas of overpopulation to areas of demand for pet adoption.

This year, TCR was granted such an important grant to help develop our very own Transportation Program. \$15,000 was granted to TCR that can go towards equipment, containment & supplies, volunteer and staffing support, transport preparation for animals, and direct costs associated with transportation.

PetSmart Charities Adoption Prep Grant

PetSmart Charities adoption prep grants support PetSmart Charities Partners' efforts to help homeless animals find their forever homes via their PetSmart Charities Adoption Centers. Funding may go towards vaccinations, spaying or neutering, staffing and volunteer support, and containment and supplies. Toronto Cat Rescue is privileged to receive grant support from PetSmart Charities!

TCR is a proud partner of Purrplan, a virtual veterinary health care service exclusively for cats is Canadian owned. Purrplan's charity program helps charities offset the costs associated with rescue efforts. For every member enrolled, Purrplan donates a one time \$10, and 75 cents per month to one charity of their choice, and in 2019, Toronto Cat Rescue was added as one of these top charities that members can select. All money raised through this partnership goes towards helping cats within Toronto Cat Rescue care.

Volunteer Spotlight

Large Rescue Team



TCR's partnership with SPA Beauce-Etchemin, QC was stronger than ever in 2019. We transferred over 200 cats from this shelter over 4 large rescues. Our friends in Quebec have a very low adoption turnover and live outcome is a huge challenge for them. TCR's partnership has brought them great relief and changed the fortune for hundreds of cats. We could not have transfered these 200+ cats alone, the unsung TCR heroes who were on the front lines is our Large Rescue Team. This team of 10 volunteers (not all pictured) worked non-stop for two days. They prepared cages and supplies, were on their feet for 10-12 hours per day, tending to the cats every need.

They performed basic health checks, and behavior assessments to triage veterinary care and find the suitable foster homes.

Watching this team spring into action and work tirelessly is the best demonstration of TCR volunteer teamwork. We are so fortunate to have such dedicated, passionate and reliable volunteers.

Large Rescue Volunteer, Lynda Alman, recounts her experience, "It is incredibly rewarding to help these beautiful cats who have gone through a difficult time in their lives before coming to us, and have traveled a long distance packed together in a truck. It's so comforting to know that because of TCR, their medical issues will be addressed, and they will be adopted into loving forever

Going into the fiscal year 2019, the board of directors developed a budget that mirrored our strategic plan. Year 1 was a Focus on Foundation for TCR, and the financial position of the organization reflected that. Year 2 built of that foundation and was our Focus on Development. That development resulted in a strong increase in TCRs ability to raise funds and manage our programs efficiently and effectively. As a result, TCR posted a strong surplus for the fiscal year 2019.

TCR engaged in it's second annual audit of the financial statements as well, and we're proud to report that the auditors found no material errors and concluded that the financial statements are presented fairly. I would like to thank all the staff and volunteers for their efforts in ensuring that our financial controls remain strong and transparent.
